



OVERVIEW:

- Another storm is expected to bring snow, rain, gusty winds, and coastal flooding Friday night and Saturday.
- The storm looks quite similar to the one we just experienced on Wednesday, but the impacts are likely to not be as severe as the most recent event as the system moves more quickly. Coastal flooding is a high concern from this system.

TIMING	 Snow moves in from southwest to northeast overnight Friday night and early Saturday morning. Snow changes to rain along the coast Saturday morning, and changes to rain south of the mountains on Saturday. System moves out Saturday afternoon.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	 High wind watch and a coastal flood watch has been issued for parts of <u>Maine</u> and <u>New Hampshire</u>. Moderate to possibly major coastal flooding is possible during the midday Saturday high tide. Any recent damage to dunes and flood mitigation systems will leave areas more vulnerable than usual. Light to moderate snowfall accumulation across interior locations will lead to hazardous travel conditions Friday night and Saturday. Gusty southeasterly winds may be damaging Saturday along the coast and north of the mountains.
