


Important Updates

- → Increasing threat for moderate flooding on rivers and tributaries in the mountains and foothills.
- → High Wind Warnings and Wind Advisories have been expanded north and west.
- → Flood Watch has been expanded to include interior York and Cumberland counties in Maine, plus Strafford county in New Hampshire
- → Coastal Flood, Storm, and River Flood (Pemigewasset) Warnings remain in place.


Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing	Confidence
Flooding	Heavy rain and snow melt will lead to areas of flooding with many road closures and minor property damage possible.	Mountains and Interior	Mainly today and tonight. Rivers may respond through mid-week.	75% - High
Wind	Fallen tree limbs and a few uprooted trees are likely. Scattered power outages are possible.	New Hampshire & Western Maine	Peaking this afternoon and evening	75% - High
Coastal Flooding	Widespread flooding of low-lying vulnerable areas near the waterfront with up to 2 feet of inundation. Numerous coastal roads will become flooded with a few neighborhoods being cut-off due to closed roads.	Coast	This afternoon	75% - High
Marine	Big waves and high winds will cause extremely dangerous seas even for the largest boats.	Coastal Waters	Today	75% - High
Snow	No impact is expected from this storm.	New Hampshire & Western Maine	Through Tonight	75% - High

- Rivers will crest tomorrow evening into Tuesday











**Updated River Forecasts expected by noon **



- Kennebec River at Augusta


Key Messages

 Main stem rivers will see strong responses and may experience flood conditions through mid-week.





Coastal Flooding




Key Messages

- Minor to moderate coastal flooding impacts around 3 PM high tide today
- 2-3 ft of storm surge expected
- Minor inundation up to 1 foot
- 15-20 ft nearshore waves, highest along the Midcoast
- Moderate dune overwash and severe beach erosion possible due to significant wave action




Peak Wind Gusts Expected




Key Messages


- Southeasterly wind gusts up to 65 mph possible along the coast and downslope areas.
- Scattered power outages possible areawide, mostly likely along the coast.
- Strongest wind gusts late this morning through this evening

Event Summary

Key Messages

- A significant storm continues to impact the region late through this evening with flooding rain, strong winds, and coastal flooding.
- Period of greatest impact: Daytime today

What We Are Certain Of:

- 3-5" of rain in the mountains and foothills will lead to minor to moderate flooding of rivers and tributaries.
- Strong, damaging winds expected on the coast.
- No wintry precipitation.

What We Are Less Certain Of:

Higher end of impacts

	Minor to moderate tributary and main stem river flooding possible. Widespread poor drainage and low-lying area flooding possible. Localized flash flooding also possible, especially across the terrain.
	Damaging winds possible along with coast with scattered to numerous power outages. Strong, gusty winds likely areawide with scattered power outages possible.
	Minor to moderate coastal flooding and overwash expected. Severe beach erosion is likely.
2	Storm force southeasterly winds possible along with seas of 15-25 ft outside of the bays.
**	No wintry impacts are expected with this system.
