
Do you have

All take-back locations will run from 10am to 2pm!

Why Dispose of Old and Unused Medications?

- Medicines in the home medicine cabinets are highly at risk of being misused and abused.
- A majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.
- Many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the toilet or throwing them away both potential safety and health hazards.

The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) needs our help!

DEA will be collecting potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs for destruction at sites nationwide on **Saturday, April 30th from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. local time**. The service is free and <u>anonymous</u>, no questions asked.
