## Why Dispose of Old and Unused Medications?

- Medicines in the home medicine cabinets are highly at risk of being misused and abused.
- **A majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.**
- Many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the toilet or throwing them away – both potential safety and health hazards.

## The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) needs our help!

DEA will be collecting potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs for destruction at sites nationwide on **Saturday, April 30th from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. local time**. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.
