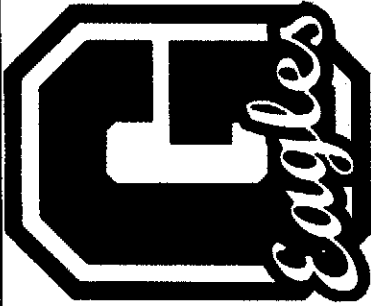

He is currently an Outreach Coordinator at the Riverbank House in Laconia—a residential program for men seeking recovery from addiction and self-destruction. 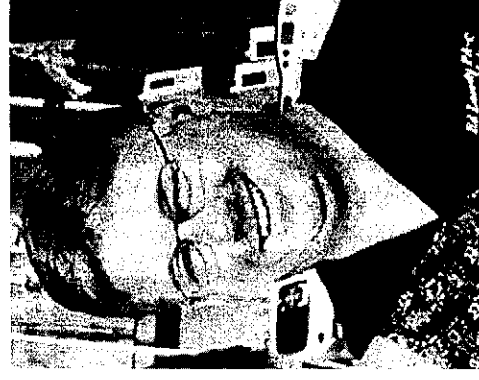
