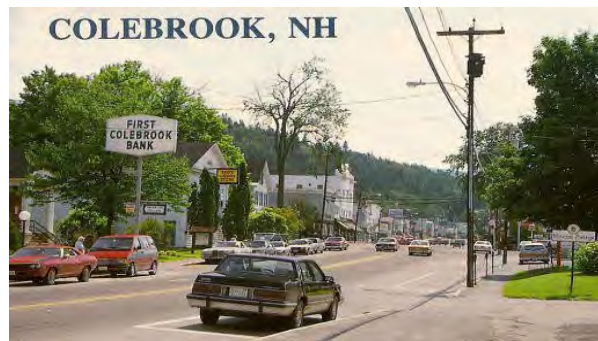

About Colebrook

Nestled deep inside the Great North Woods region of Northern New Hampshire, Colebrook is the hub of northern Coos County, and is the largest town located north of Northumberland. To the north is Stewartstown, to the east is Dixville, to the south is Columbia and to the west, across the Connecticut River, is Lemington and Canaan Vermont. Colebrook's villages include, Kidderville, Upper Kidderville and Factory Village.

Colebrook was originally known as a farming town and the soil is said to be almost matchless in New England. Its inhabitants claim there is not a single lot of land in town that would not make a good farm and produce an abundance of crops. According to the 1874 Gazetteer, Colebrook was the potato capital of New Hampshire, producing over 120,000 bushels per year, most of which were milled into potato starch and distilled into whiskey. The town was also known for its saw-mill and from 1868-1915 saw witness to the great log drives.

Population in Colebrook has changed very little over the last 50 years with 2,116 residents in 1950 and 2,301 residents in the 2010 census. With the decline in the paper industry and the saw-mills we see that 12% of the population lives below the poverty line. The top five employers in the area are now the Balsams Corporation, Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital, Colebrook School District, Town of Colebrook and First Colebrook Bank.

Colebrook's public school system includes one high school and elementary school. The *Colebrook Chronicle* and the *Colebrook News and Sentinel* are the two local newspapers.

What to See in the Colebrook Area



Colebrook: Colebrook is the regional shopping center, with Le Rendez-Vous French Bakery, La Perle's IGA, Mostly Muffins, Fiddleheads and much more. The town is also known for Beaver Brook Falls, a perfect location for a picnic, the Coos Trail through Dixville Notch and Diamond Pond. Don't forget to check out the Moose Festival in August or the Harvest Fair in October!



Pittsburg: Explore Pittsburg, the town with the largest area in New Hampshire. Discover Garfield Falls, where half the fun is finding out where it is, be tempted by the 1/2lb whoopie pie at Dube's Pittstop, watch the sunset over Lake Francis atop Murphy Dam, go fishing on the Trophy Stretch of the Connecticut River or cruise for moose along Moose Alley.

Stewartstown: Stewartstown (and Clarksville) are located at the 45th Parallel, visit this landmark putting you halfway between the equator and the North Pole. The village of West Stewartstown is home to some of the best Poutine in New Hampshire. If you like snowmobiling then you'll love watching or participating in the annual Sno-Deo at Coleman State Park.



Dixville Notch: Dixville Notch is home to the Balsams grand hotel, known for its incredible food, Cross-Country and Downhill skiing and its beautiful location. Nationwide the Balsams is known as the Polling Location for Dixville Notch. Every four years at midnight the nation watches the residents of Dixville Notch become the first voters to vote in the "First in the Nation" Presidential Primary and vote for President in the General Election.

While in Dixville feel like you're on top of the world by hiking your way to the amazing flat topped Table Rock, which hangs 2,510 feet over a deep gorge!
