Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an evidence-based training designed to train everyone on skills to help someone experiencing a mental health problem or crisis. Those trained in MHFA have greater confidence and skill in providing help, advising people to seek help and decreasing stigmatizing attitudes.

Participants will...

- Recognize the potential risk factors and warning signs for a range of mental health problems, including depression, anxiety/ trauma
- Use a 5-step action plan to help an individual in crisis connect with appropriate professional help
- Interpret the prevalence of various mental health disorders in the US and the need for reduced negative attitudes in their communities
- Apply knowledge of the appropriate professional, peer, social, and self-help resources available to help someone with a mental health problem treat and manage the problem and achieve recovery
