First time using Zoom? The instructions below should help you access the virtual event. It will only take a couple minutes to load Zoom onto your computer or use the app on a smart phone or tablet. You will then use the link above and input the Meeting ID and Password when prompted.

#### Using Zoom for the First Time: It's easier than you think.

When you use Zoom for the first time, Zoom will provide you with instructions on how to download and install the software if you're on a computer (or app if you're on mobile).

(If using a computer, each web browser will have different instructions.)

Your device may ask you for permission to install Zoom. Please allow Zoom to be installed.

Once Zoom is installed, you should see a window pop up. Click on "Zoom Meetings" and then on the "OPEN" button.

**Zoom may ask for your name.** You can identify as you wish in this box. The text entered in this box will be your name in the participant list and will appear under your web cam video should you choose to turn it on.

Click the "JOIN" button after you have typed in your name.

Then choose how you would like to hear and to talk to the other participants in the Zoom meeting: If you have a computer with a microphone or a computer headset connected and you want to use your computer for audio, click on "COMPUTER AUDIO" and then on the green "JOIN AUDIO BY COMPUTER" button.

OR you can choose to join by phone while you view the presentation on your computer. Click on the tab labeled "phone call" and call the listed phone number. Follow the prompts to enter the meeting ID and your password. (Please note that you may incur phone charges.)

NOTE: If you're on a smart phone or tablet, you'll be prompted to download the Zoom app. Please follow the same meeting ID and password instructions from there.
