Objectives:

- Explain the **disease transmission** of Human Immunodeficiency Virus/Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (HIV/AIDS), Hepatitis C (HCV), and Hepatitis B (HBV).
- Describe the process and benefits of testing for HIV/AIDS, HCV, and HBV.
